Darcy Fleury



Inspector Darcy Fleury is a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. He is also an active member of the sporting society, and has enjoyed the opportunities for community involvement that both of these interests have provided.

Inspector Fleury engaged into the Royal Canadian Mounted Police in 1987 at Minnedosa, Manitoba. Upon graduation from the Training Academy, Depot Division at Regina, Saskatchewan he was posted to "O" Division Immigration and Passport Section in Toronto. In May 1992 Darcy transferred to the Federal Enforcement Section at Kenora, Ontario. January 1996 saw Darcy transfer to general duty at Iqaluit Detachment. He subsequently transferred to "G" Division General Investigation Section at Yellowknife Headquarters in 1997.

Inspector Fleury was promoted to Corporal in September 1998, Sergeant in November 2002, Staff Sergeant in August 2008 and was commissioned to the rank of Inspector in August 2008. He is currently seconded to the Government of the Northwest Territories Department of Justice as the Manager of Policing & Crime Prevention programs.

Darcy became involved in youth soccer several years ago in Yellowknife. In June 2006 he was the Assistant Coach for the NWT Under 16 female soccer team. His efforts saw this team travel to the 2007 Western Canada Summer Games. He was also heavily involved with the St. Patrick's High School indoor and outdoor soccer programs.

In 2008 he was once again asked to take on the role of assistant coach for the 2009 NWT Women's Canada Summer Games Team. However, due to a technical requirement that one of the coaches be a female, he stepped aside and took on the role as team manager/trainer, thus ensuring he remained involved as was his desire.

As the team's manager/trainer he developed a program which ensured the team members were physically prepared and tactically aware of the higher competitive style of play. This team went on to participate in the Canada Summer Games in Summerside, PEI.
